The Legend

In the desert of Jordan, Bedouin Tribes roam the lands and travel from waterhole to waterhole, leading their flocks of goats and sheep. Someone described the scene there as Bible Characters carrying shoe boxes. Most of the Bedouin Children had never received a gift much less a Christmas gift, in their lives. Many could not believe that everything in their shoe box was for them.

Several removed one item, then handed the shoe box back, content with just one small gift. A little boy came up to a team member holding a tiny numb of a pencil that he had been using. He whispered "I counted fourteen pencils in my box. Do I have to give them back?" She assured him that they were his to keep.

Some of the children even save wrapping paper and ribbons from the gifts, so lovingly folded and tucked away. To children who have nothing, everything is a treasure. We were told that in years to come as the Rashaydeh Tribe gather around the fire to share tradition and folklore, this momentous day would be included and so being the legend of the Show Box.

Let us give joy to a child letting them know they are not forgotten.
